2012 ANNUAL CAMPAIGN NEARS GOAL

Campaign Co-Chairs, Molly Nettles and Steve Van Horn, agreed to spearhead a committee to raise \$150,000. These funds will help defray operating costs of the Clinic, which serves 1,200 residents of Kershaw County who have no health insurance. The Clinic provides them with medicine and medical care at no cost.

The Annual Campaign Committee has collected \$125,000 since December 1, 2011. "We are encouraged that in this depressed economy the number of donations is up 35%," said Nettles. "We have actively recruited committee members who represent all areas of the county and all generations."

The Community Medical Clinic has no federal or state funding and depends totally on local donors and foundations. With the help of over 200 volunteers and one and one-half million dollars of medicine from pharmaceutical companies, a one-dollar donation provides \$12.50 in medical care at the Clinic. Because the need is even greater this year, any amount will help.

Volunteer Providers Honored at Clinic Breakfast

The clinic invited volunteer doctors, dentists and nurse practitioners to an early breakfast on Monday January 23, 2012. The CMC depends on strong volunteer relationships to conduct its operations. It is a family practice medical clinic. Patient referrals are made to community dentists and specialists when necessary. They represent these specialties: surgery, urology, nephrology, pulmonology, dermatology, breast specialist, gastroenterology, endocrinology, cardiac surgery, pathology, and radiology.

There were many challenges for the clinic in 2011, one of which was recruiting a new fulltime nurse practitioner. For six months the clinic looked to the volunteer medical providers to shore up the busy patient schedule. The Clinic is blessed to have the commitment and support of the medical community, as the year ended with over 5500 visits, 822 patients seen with 207 new patients now having a medical home.

We also have been preparing for healthcare reform as we make sure our infrastructure is flexible to meet the coming challenges. We will be installing a new practice management system with the capabilities of an electronic medical record.

We provide additional services, such as applying for SNAP (food stamps) and filing taxes, through The Benefit Bank program. These added value services help our patients qualify for other safety net programs.

It is hard to believe that it has been five years since the new clinic was built. The clinic has had to go through a few repairs to keep its welcoming appearance. The parking lot for one has been repaired and the sign has been moved to mark the new entrance more clearly. We will be adding some landscaping as well.

The staff is looking forward to 2012 as we welcome Jessica Wilkes our new fulltime nurse practitioner. The fundraising event schedule is set. All runners and walkers get ready to don your best sneakers and come out and support our 5th Annual Clinic Classic, 5k run/walk, 10k run and the challenge for 12 years and younger on April 21. There will be a new event this year, the Camden Antiques Fair in October 18, 19, 20, and 21. We are looking forward to partner with the Steeplechase Museum.

The Annual Campaign is still underway and we are closing in on our goal of \$150,000. Our campaign chairs, Molly Nettles and Steve Vanhorn have been working hard to increase the number of donors throughout Kershaw County.

I am proud to have the most dedicated and qualified employees in our clinic to serve Kershaw County's most vulnerable population. The Clinic volunteers continue to work diligently to keep the high standards the board has committed to our community. Thanks to the business community for their continued support as well as Kershaw Health and the medical community to help provide primary healthcare to the uninsured in Kershaw County. It takes all of us.
